Overview of the Wide Range Assessment of Memory and Learning, Third Edition (WRAML-3)

Workshop Description:

Memory plays an essential role in learning and development. Deficits in memory are evident in a wide array of learning disabilities and related disorders. The ability to identify one's memory profile can enhance critical intervention and learning strategies.

This presentation will provide an overview of the Wide Range Assessment of Memory and Learning, 3rd Edition with a focus on test structure, visual, verbal, immediate, delayed, and working memory, recognition, and attention/concentration.

- 2. Identify core components of the WRAML 3 assessment
- 3. Understand appropriate situations in which to use the WRAML3 Brief Form or WRAML3 Screener Form rather than the full measure

During this session we will review the process of recovery through a PREPaRE framework and discuss how grief and distress present within the current context of the global pandemic.

- 2. Identify the various forms and developmental considerations of grief
- 3. Understand the variables associated with the current state of the pandemic impacting recovery

Dr. Melinda Cruz graduated from the University at Buffalo. Prior to Radford University, Dr. Cruz worked as a school psychologist and student services supervisor of school based mental health professionals in a Virginia public school division. Dr. Cruz is a Nationally Certified School Psychologist and Virginia Licensed Clinical Psychologist. She currently teaches courses on assessment, mental health prevention and intervention and supervises practicum students. Dr. Cruz has research interests in school based mental health services within MTSS, crisis prevention and intervention, suicide prevention and intervention and resiliency. She currently serves on the NASP School Safety and Crisis Response Committee and is a trainer for PREPaRE Workshop 1 and Workshop 2. Dr. Cruz is the current coordinator of the Radford University school psychology program.

Emily Dove, EdS. holds an Educational Specialist and Master's degree in School Psychology from James Madison University. She is a Licensed School Psychologist and Nationally Certified School Psychologist. Prior to working at Radford University, Mrs. Dove worked as a school psychologist in public schools in Virginia and North Carolina. In her current role at Radford University, Mrs. Dove provides clinical training and supervision to school psychology students, as well as teaches School Psychological Services and practicum courses. Mrs. Dove also serves as the Administrative Director for the Center for Assessment and Psychological Services. She is a NASP certified PREPaRE Workshop 1 and Workshop 2 trainer.
